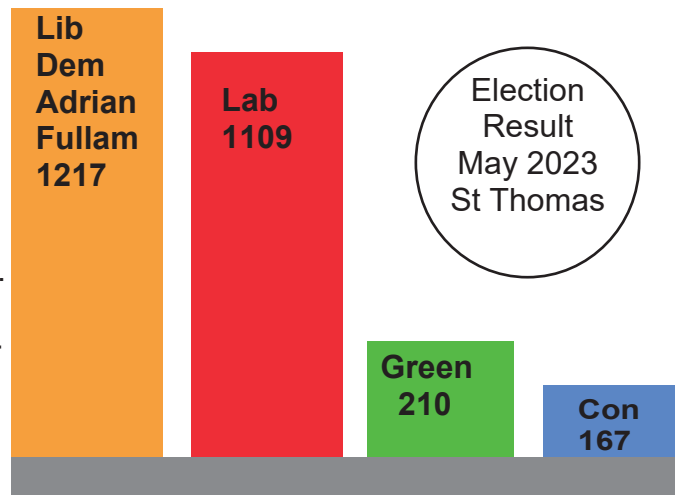
## Speaking up for St Thomas

During this time there will be parking and through traffic restrictions. Alternative routes will be set up.

Following multiple comments about the condition of the roads, Adrian has surveyed the ward and identified the following potholes and road defects as well as roads in generally poor condition.

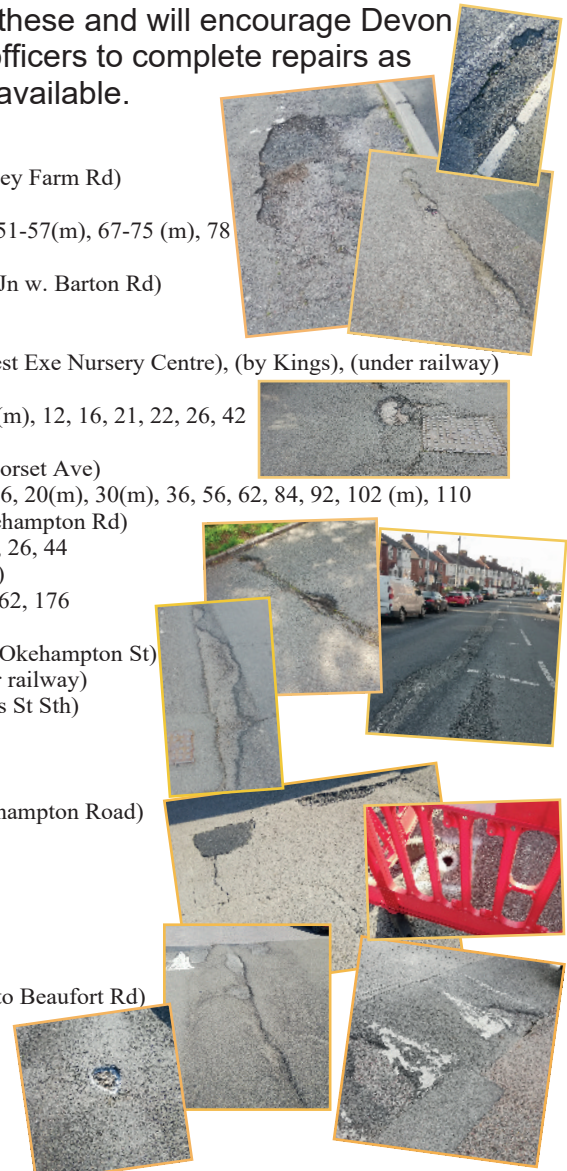
He has reported these and will encourage Devon County Council officers to complete repairs as resources come available.
