Local Lib Dems Demand Better for our NHS

Will Aczel, Lib Dem MP candidate for Exeter, said:



"A record 1 in 7 people are on an NHS England waiting list. In 2015-16, 1,014 people had to wait over 12-hours in A&E. Now it's over 1,000 a day.

"Instead of a plan to address this crisis, the Conservatives are cutting real-terms NHS funding this year by £4.7bn. At the same time, they are giving big banks a £3.8bn tax cut. How much more out-of-touch can they get?

"Labour fail to offer hope for real change. The Shadow Health Secretary said Labour "would hold the door wide open" for the private sector in the NHS. This would further destabilise our NHS, drain it of doctors and nurses, burden it with debt, and skim off what should be public money.

"Lib Dems demand better. We recognise the value of our NHS and want to enable people to thrive through a strong social safety net. We will invest, reform, and recruit to revitalise our NHS."

Labour's plans to tackle housing and climate crises in total disarray

Two companies set-up and supported by Labour-run Exeter City Council were axed last year. Exeter City Living and Exeter City Futures had meant to address Exeter's housing and climate crises. The Labour Council allocated over £100 million to **Exeter City Living alone.**

Philip Thomas said: "Over the last decade, Labour have promoted a culture of limited scrutiny and transparency.

"This causes Labour to waste tens of millions of the public purse on



vanity projects: Exeter City Living, Exeter City Futures, and St Sidwell's Point. These precious council funds could have been spent on recycling, parks, and community grants initiatives that benefit all our communities.

"Labour ignored auditor's warnings and repeated calls by Lib Dem Clirs and others for proper oversight of connected companies and loans.

"I am fighting for more scrutiny transparency, and accountability so that no more public money is wasted."

Lib Dems oppose Labour's cuts to Citizens Advice Exeter

Citizens Advice Exeter provide much-needed support to those who often have nowhere left to turn. Last year, they dealt with hundreds of issues in Priory Ward alone. Yet Labour have decided to cut funding for this crucial service by 62.5% (£125k) without public consultation. Exeter Liberal Democrats oppose these cuts and demand greater scrutiny of the council's finances.

Lib Dems propose household food waste and glass recycling for the whole city

Our fully costed proposals to unlock food waste and glass recycling for the whole Exeter were voted against by Labour en bloc without debate.

The news comes as Exeter Labour's recycling rate has fallen further to an abysmal 24.5%, less than half the Devon average.



Philip Thomas, Lib Dem City Council candidate for Priory, said: "Over the past decade, Exeter Labour have squandered tens of millions of taxpayers' money on vanity projects whilst neglecting basic services.

"Priory is still waiting for household food waste and glass recycling. Other council areas have had these services for decades. Do Labour think Priory residents will continue to accept being lumbered with frequent or onerous trips to public glass banks?

"Nine of the top ten English councils for recycling are Lib Dem-led. A vote for the Lib Dems is a vote for action on recycling and our environment."
